CCA's new home establishes the beginning of a growing downtown Arts District.

Sculpture Park
SIH creates a sculpture garden in the parking lot of the Julia Bldg. showcasing SIU'S Blacksmithing Department (#1 in the country, #2 in the world!)



Town Square Park



Annual Music Festivals and Art & Wine Fairs are held in the park bringing in thousands of people. Festivals spill across highway 13 south to include the Indoor Farmer's Market

Indoor Farmer's Market

An event space for weddings, conferences, festivals and entertainment. Houses a commercial kitchen that serves local farmers featuring a farm to table school lunch program and servicing local food carts. A dog run next to Farmer's Market encourages people to linger outside.
